

#### The Most Holy Trinity

This Trinity Sunday we celebrate the deepest mystery of our faith, a God who, being three persons in one Godhead, can, in His own being, manifest and embody a love so deep, so rich, so expansive that it gives rise to God's desire to share that love through creation and by which He, and He alone, is worthy of all our worship and of the first-fruits of our love.



It is a love that is characterized by total self-gift, of the persons of the Trinity to each other and of God, particularly in the flesh and blood of the Son, to His creation. We are invited into the life of the Trinity. Our days here on earth are a preparation for the fullness of our participation in God's life in heaven. It begins sacramentally with our baptism and confirmation, through which we are adopted into God's family and given a full share of the Holy Spirit.

We most often invoke the Father, Son and Spirit at the beginning of our meal prayer, and it is mostly merely rote. Let's begin to think about what we are doing. In His name (as His child and in our baptismal appointment as priest, prophet and king) we are blessing the food with His power and grace. In His name, we are receiving into our bodies the gift of food blessed at our request by our God. It is worth meditating on what is happening and how we ought to act every time we pray "In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." So much is happening!

But the most essential move of the life of a Christian who is leaning into the life of the Trinity is Mary's fiat. Let it be done to me according to thy will. I'm thinking primarily not of her first fiat at the Annunciation, but of what is called her second fiat, which happens at the foot of the cross. Mary is standing at the cross, below her crucified and dying Son, letting the sword of sorrow pierce her heart. Looking at this fiat from the perspective of entering into the life of the Trinity, the essential thing isn't the crucifixion. It is the willingness of Mary to abide with God even in this place, to listen to His words even in this place of deepest sorrow.

We can let life's stresses and hardships pull us away from God. It is also easy to unthinkingly let life's many good things pull us away from God – family time, soccer games, trips, hobbies or our favorite shows. Mary's fiat is essential in all these areas. When we say, "let it be done to me according to your will," we are accepting, even before a particular hardship or blessing, the desire of God to be with us, to love us and to hold us close. His will is that we are with Him, Father, Son, Spirit. Happy Trinity Sunday!



#### Scripture of the Week



"Those who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God." (Romans 8:14)

For most of us, less is known about the Holy Spirit than the other persons of the Most Holy Trinity. After all, much of the Old Testament is filled with stories of God the Father, from creation through numerous covenants and continuing with stories of the Father speaking with Moses or the prophets. And, of course, the New



Testament is filled with words and deeds of Jesus. But we hear far less of the Holy Sprit.

Today's solemnity provides one of the very best explanations of the Holy Spirit that exists, especially as a follow up to last week's solemnity of Pentecost. God is a family, specifically a family of love. God the Father freely and COMPLETELY loves the Son who, in turn, receives the Father's love and returns it with His own love, freely and COMPLETELY. So complete is this eternal exchange of love, freely given and fully received, that it is named the Holy Spirit. We've been invited to live within this exchange of love, to enter into the Holy Spirit - and invite the Holy Spirit to enter into us. COMPLETELY.




#### Steubenville, We Still Have Spots to Fill
