Growing Together: Exciting Developments at Holy Name of Jesus

Greetings Brothers and Sisters!

I pray you are well as we close the liturgical season of Easter and begin the calendar season of summer! I am pleased to announce that several plans for improving our campus are coming to fruition this summer. Many of these projects were initiated before I became the Parochial Administrator (Pastor) of Holy Name of Jesus, and so, I am grateful for all those who put in a lot of work behind the scenes. Rest assured, all projects have undergone rigorous vetting by our Finance Council and received formal approval. Additionally, our two Lay Trustees have thoroughly reviewed and endorsed each project.

I am delighted to share that pending approval from the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis, we are moving forward with plans to construct a new classroom to meet the urgent space needs of our expanding school. Due to a steady rise in enrollment, we have had to increase from two to three student sections in multiple grades. Over the past five years, the School Advisory Committee (SAC) and parish staff have diligently optimized the efficiency of our existing space and collaborated with ATSR, a reputable architectural firm, to explore expanding our school footprint.


Typically, a fundraising campaign would be required for such a project. However, God blessed us with an unexpected gift. Upon learning of our pressing space constraints, generous benefactors have graciously offered to finance the construction of a new classroom, which will be added to the southwest part of our existing school building. Additionally, thanks to generous contributions to Fund a Need at our recent IgNight Gala, our school bathrooms will also receive a much-needed facelift. With profound gratitude, let us unite in prayer, seeking God's abundant blessings for these individuals for their remarkable generosity.

Assuming approval from the Archdiocese, these projects are slated to begin this summer with the aim of completion by the end of October. In the interim, the school is prepared to optimize existing space until the projects are finalized.

Second, another aspect that came into consideration during Fr. Steve's final year before retirement was the state of our organ in the worship space. The current organ, installed in the 1980s through the generosity of a parish family, has reached a point where its mechanical upkeep is both intricate and costly. Recognizing this, and with the arrival of our new music director, I am delighted to announce the acquisition of a state-of-the-art digital organ made by Allen Organs. It will take six to nine months for the organ to be made and installed. Again, this purchase was made possible by a generous donation by a parish family and the steadfast support of our parish.

Third, you may have noticed some of the new landscaping at the main entrance of our parking lot. Due to the lack of needing to pay for snow removal last winter, we were able to reallocate funds to make much needed updates and to develop a

All participants are asked to obtain their own copy of the work. We have a link below to make sure you get a copy of the right book, but feel free to source your copy from wherever you wish.



Father Elijah: An Apocalypse By Michael D. O'Brien

Michael O'Brien presents a thrilling apocalyptic novel about the condition of the Roman Catholic Church at the end of time. It explores the state of the modern world, and the strengths and weaknesses of the contemporary religious scene, by taking his central character, Father Elijah Schafer, a Carmelite priest, on a secret mission for the Vatican which embroils him in a series of crises and subterfuges affecting the ultimate destiny of the Church.

In this richly textured tale, Father Elijah crosses Europe and the Middle East, moves through the echelons of world power, meets saints and sinners, presidents, judges, mystics, embattled Catholic journalists, faithful priests and a conspiracy of traitors within the very House of God. This is an apocalypse in the old literary sense, but one that was written in the light of Christian revelation.

Helena is the intelligent, horse-mad daughter of a British chieftain who is thrown into marriage with the man who will one day become the Roman emperor Constantius. Leaving home for lands unknown, she spends her adulthood seeking truth in the religions, mythologies and philosophies of the declining ancient world, and becomes initiated into Christianity just as it is recognized as the religion of the Roman Empire. *Helena* - a novel that Evelyn Waugh considered to be his favorite, and most ambitious, work - deftly traverses the forces of corruption, treachery, enlightenment and political intrigue of Imperial Rome as it brings to life an inspiring heroine.

Update on Implementation of the Archdiocesan Synod Directives for Year 2

As many of you know by now the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis has been leading efforts to revitalize parish ministry for the last five to six years in what is known as a local synod (synod means walking or on the journey together in Greek). This included a multi-year listening process which was interrupted by COVID and we are now on year two of three of implementation.

Our first year was all about Small Groups in which we had over 40 groups and 360 plus participants during the season of Lent! Several of the groups continue to meet and many will resume this Fall as we make semiannual "Small Group Launches" a part of our parish life going forward. Year 2 of the process is to continue to strengthen this ministry with the focus of the content being centered on the themes of the Mass and the Eucharist!





Thank You for Your Generosity!

As we approach the midpoint of the year and the end of our fiscal year on June 30, 2024, we wanted to provide a brief update on our financial position.





As of April 2024, our operating expenses stand at \$803,000, which is 9% below budget and 11% lower than last year. However, our facilities expenses have risen to \$418,000, exceeding our budget by 37%, though still 19% less than last year. The increase is largely due to inflation impacting the costs of maintaining our aging buildings and grounds. Despite ministry expenses and other costs being 18% below budget at \$940,000, this is mainly due to the loss of key staff positions, resulting in increased workload for the rest of our dedicated team. We are excited for new hires to come onboard!

Your generosity has kept our collection steady at \$2.7 million fiscal year-to-date. With your continued support, we will embark on major summer projects and address some essential maintenance projects as well. Your prayers, participation and financial contributions sustain our day-to-day operations. In June, we will reach out to those who pledged during our Call To Belong stewardship invitation, updating them on their pledges. We deeply appreciate your commitment, allowing Holy Name of Jesus to thrive in our community.

To streamline your financial contributions, we encourage you to explore electronic giving options, which simplify the process and ensure consistent support. Additionally, please consider Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs) from IRA accounts or stock donations for potential tax advantages. 


