More Than Ordinary

As we enter a season of Ordinary Time, it is worth pondering just what that means. Sometimes it can seem as if the Church calendar is jam-packed with memorials, feasts and holidays. Indeed it



is, and much more so than we often realize. The term the Church uses for those "ordinary" days in which there is no particular feast or memorial is *ferial*, and the root of ferial is festival. Thus there are no ordinary days, strictly speaking, for they are all God's days and worthy of our praise and rejoicing.

St. John Chrysostom puts it succinctly: "where love rejoices, there is festivity." This is the fitting posture towards God and towards God's creation that we, as Christians, are called to adopt always and everywhere. Thus the ordinary is seen most clearly as extraordinary.

This is first of all an affirmation of God and His own first judgment of creation, for it was on the seventh day that God beheld what He had made and pronounced it very good. There is no deeper affirmation of the essential goodness of all of reality than this statement by God himself, who brought all things into being and, without exception, affirms and loves all things. It is our fitting participation in creation to affirm God's judgment with our own vision. "Where love rejoices, there is festivity."

Where we fail to participate in God's vision and to experience each day as at least ferial, we slip into the merely servile and utilitarian, into that place where our daily work is drudgery and our daily bread mere nutrition. It is a place of slavery to lesser gods as we fail to remember whose we are and in whose world we are. Failure to be festive traps us in lies of our secular age.

In contrast, festivity is liberation. It frees us because it is a participation in God's rejoicing, in His timeless vision, as His immortal sons and daughters. We pass beyond the barriers of this present life on earth.

That is Ordinary Time, ordinary only in the sense that we Christians never step away from the ferial. Our default posture is to see as God sees and to love what He loves, and to let that extraordinary affirmation seep into our souls where we find it cannot be contained but must express itself in joy. "Where love rejoices, there is festivity."
