#### At Every Remembrance of You

I had a chance a couple of Thanksgivings ago to preach at the church I grew up at, Zion Lutheran Church in Rockford, Illinois. The Lutheran lectionary closely mirrors our lectionary, but the reading from Philippians had an extra verse that wasn't proclaimed in Catholic parishes that Sunday: "I give thanks to my God at every remembrance of you, praying always with joy in my every prayer for all of you..." (1:3-4.) I was very grateful for that extra verse as I visited the community where I was baptized and



where I began my faith journey. I am able to join my voice with Paul's and give thanks for my brothers and sisters in Christ who are miles away but still in my heart.

Ever since then I have thought about how Paul poured his heart and soul into a community only to be called by God to a new place. Nevertheless, even though he left the place, the people did not leave his heart. "I give thanks to my God at every remembrance of you." Paul expresses a similar sentiment in most of his letters, and more and more I can relate.

I am very grateful for my year at Holy Name of Jesus, for the opportunity to serve under Fr. Wratkowski, to work with the incredible staff and to receive so many blessings from the people of Holy Name of Jesus. The year has gone quickly because it has been filled with so many good things! As I leave Holy Name of Jesus, know that you will not leave my heart. With Paul, "I give thanks to my God at every remembrance of you, praying always with joy in my every prayer for all of you..."

# Scripture of the Week



"Then He asked them, 'Why were you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?"" (Mark 4:40)

It is commonly believed that the opposite of fear is courage. This is not true. Courage is the virtue of doing what needs to be done in spite of any fear. Rather, the true opposite of fear is faith.



This is what we hear Jesus say to the disciples in today's Gospel reading. That notion - "be not afraid" or "do not fear" - runs throughout the entirety of Sacred Scripture with over 300 mentions in the Old and New Testaments.

It was also a central theme of Pope St. John Paul II's pontificate. From the first Mass he celebrated as Pope until his death, St. John Paul II preached faith. *"Do not be afraid. Do not be satisfied with mediocrity. Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch.... I plead with you - never, ever give up on hope, never doubt, never tire, and never become discouraged. Be not afraid."* Faith over fear is the best choice every time.

#### **Adoration**

On Monday, May 27, over 7,000 people walked 4.5 miles in a procession from the St. Paul Seminary to Cathedral of St. Paul. Why would people of all ages spend several hours of their Memorial Day walking the streets of St. Paul? Two words; The Eucharist.

As part of the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage, this procession started in Lake Itaca on May 17, reaching St. Paul on May 27, and then moving onto other cities where it will reach its final destination in Indianapolis, IN on July 16. Why spend two months making this several hundred-mile journey when it would be easier and quicker to hop on a plane and fly to Indianapolis? Two words; The Eucharist.

For the non-Catholics, this pilgrimage might not make a lot of sense, but for Catholics, it is much more than that.

The Eucharist is the body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ and whenever we see the Eucharist in a procession or sitting quietly in an Adoration Chapel, we know that we are with Jesus.

- Low Gluten Hosts: If you would like to receive communion but require a low gluten host, please drop by the Sacristy – located down the hall immediately before the Good Samaritan Center (social hall), across from the bathrooms and inform a clergy member or sacristan of your need.
- Large Print Worship Aids: Several large print worship aids are available on the table outside the main doors to the worship space for those who would like one.
- Hearing Aids: If you have difficulty hearing the Mass, you can request a hearing aid at our front desk, immediately to the right as you enter through our church's main doors.
- Coffee and Donuts: After our 8:30 and 10:30 a.m. Masses, we invite you to come to the Good Samaritan Center (across from the worship space) and enjoy coffee, donuts and great conversation with others in our community.
- Nursery During the School Year: Children of all ages are welcome at Mass indeed, these youngsters recall Jesus' very words, "Let the children come to me... for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these" (Matthew 19:14). Our nursery is another option for parents of children ages nine months to five years, where children can play and learn about God while parents are celebrating Mass. Our nursery is open during the 8:30 and 10:30 a.m. Sunday Masses from September to May.
