Order of Installation of a Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,


I have some news that will be a joyful occasion for our whole parish family. On Sunday, Aug. 11, at the 10:30 a.m. Mass, Archbishop Hebda will be coming to our parish to formally install me as the Pastor of Holy Name of Jesus! I am sure that we are excited to host the Archbishop for this special occasion, but you also may be wondering: "Fr. Wratkowski took over for Fr. Steve at his retirement last summer. Why is Fr. Wratkowski only being installed as the Pastor now? Was Fr. Steve secretly running the parish this past year?"

Okay, that last part was said tongue in cheek. However, the question "why now?" is a valid one! The simple answer is that while I was leading the parish this past year, I was not doing so as a Pastor but as a *Parochial Administrator*. This is a canonical distinction with which not many people are familiar. To the everyday observer, there is not much of a difference. Like a Pastor, the Parochial Administrator has the responsibility to shepherd the people of God. He has an obligation to teach, sanctify and govern the members of the flock so that the divine life given to them in Baptism continues to grow unto eternal life. The Parochial Administrator is truly the spiritual father of the parish, just as the Pastor is supposed to embody the spiritual fatherhood that fosters divine life.

The main difference between the two is that the assignment as a Parochial Administrator is temporary whereas the assignment as a Pastor is an *ecclesiastical office*, which means that the function as the spiritual father bears the mark of stability. Thus, a Parochial Administrator could be moved at anytime whereas the Pastor is given a stable term. In our Archdiocese, the term is six years. Thus, starting July 1, 2024, I have the stability of a six-year assignment here at Holy Name of Jesus, with the possibility that it could be renewed for another six year term, if that was the wish of the Archbishop. I am very happy to have this stability because it is good for the parish. We can grow in relationship with each other and develop the trust that is so integral for ministry.

Given all that has been said, we have reason to celebrate! When the Archbishop comes on Aug. 11, he will preside at Mass and the *Order of Installation of a Pastor*, which takes place after the Homily. Following the Mass, we will have a reception in the Good Samaritan Center. Everyone is invited to the Mass and the reception.

Most of all, I ask for your prayers as I begin my official assignment as Pastor. You have been so good to me, and I am so grateful for that. Please continue to pray for me that I may be the good, holy and faithful Pastor the Lord wants me to be for you.

NPH - Our Little Brothers and Sisters

What is NPH?

Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH) means "Our Little Brothers and Sisters" in Spanish. NPH helps children - **pequeños** - in nine countries: Bolivia, the

Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua

and Peru. NPH ensures the children have access to nutritious food, clothing,

education and receive medical care and economic opportunity. But more importantly, they receive love - the love of a family.

How it Began

In 1954, a young, abandoned boy was arrested for stealing money from the coffers of a small church in Cuernavaca, Mexico because he was desperate to eat. With compassion and mercy, Fr. William Wasson, a young priest from Phoenix, Arizona, agreed to care for him. His response to **Matthew 25 - "Whatever you did for the least of my brothers and sisters, you did for me"** became the driving force behind NPH. And now, **70 years later**, NPH has served tens of thousands of the most vulnerable children.

The HNOJ Connection

For more than 30 years HNOJ has supported NPH by hosting Fiestas, attending Galas, sending teens and parishioners on Mission Trips to Mexico and the Dominican Republic, through financial donations and countless volunteer hours as well as with the opportunity to become godparents to the pequeños.

On the weekend of Aug. 24-25, you will be able to give to NPH during the Masses and/or sponsor one of NPH's pequeños. NPH staff and volunteers will be available after all Masses for more information or you can visit nphusa.org.

Thank you - **Gracias** - for your continued support, prayers and generosity to keep the legacy and mission of Fr. Wasson alive.






