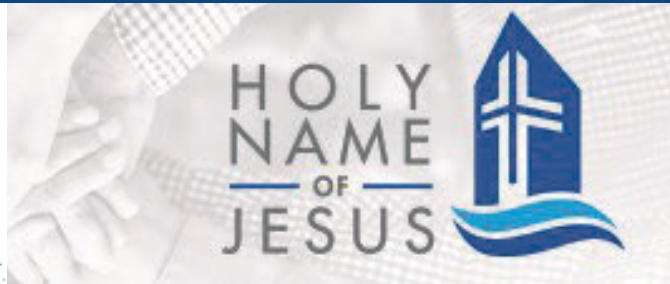

A Living Tabernacle

In sticking with the theme of the Eucharistic revival, I thought I would offer a short reflection on the incredible gift that we are given at Mass; that we are permitted to be living tabernacles of the Lord. The Church teaches that, "The Eucharistic presence of Christ begins at the moment of the consecration and endures as long as the Eucharistic species subsists" - CCC 1377. What this means is that Jesus is truly present in the host, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity, from the moment the host is consecrated at Mass to the time it is dissolved in your stomach.



This is the reason the priest puts the leftover consecrated hosts into the tabernacle before the end of Mass, because they remain the very presence of Jesus until they are consumed. Thus, for about 15 minutes after receiving Holy Communion, before the host is dissolved, we actually become living tabernacles, carrying our Lord around with us. It is a beautiful and intimate time with the Lord and this mystery should be the object of our contemplation and reflection when we go back to our pews after Communion. Since Mass usually ends before that 15 minutes is completed, it can also be a good practice to spend a little extra time in your pew after Mass concludes, to keep in mind this great mystery of which we have been found worthy of partaking. It is a time for us to rejoice and give thanks that the Lord has come to dwell in us, offering Him gratitude for this undeserved gift. This is also the reason we are required to fast for at least one hour before receiving communion, in order to make room for the King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

Christ promised to remain with His Church, even until the end of the age (Matthew 28:20), and He keeps that promise through the Eucharist. How beautiful it is that you can go into any Catholic Church around the world, and you see a red candle burning by the tabernacle, you know that Christ is present within. How much more beautiful it is then, that the Lord allows you and I to become living tabernacles of His presence at the Mass. Let us adore Christ this day for the great gift of the Eucharist.

Low Gluten Host Announcement

We will be simplifying the process for those in need of low gluten hosts starting Aug. 24. We will have a pyx with multiple low gluten hosts consecrated in the tabernacle, and the priest will always bring them with him to the left middle aisle (same aisle as always). This will eliminate the need for multiple small pyxes which will greatly simplify the set-up, purification and cleaning processes. If you require a low gluten host, all you have to do now is show up to Mass and approach communion in the left middle aisle and the priest will have low gluten hosts available for you. He will also distribute them with his left hand so as not to cross contaminate the hosts with the gluten hosts. Thank you all for your flexibility in adjusting to this change.

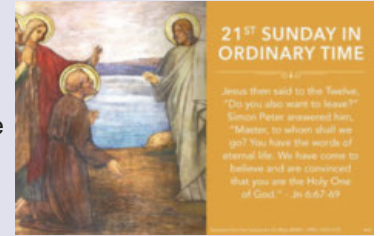


Scripture of the Week



*“As a result of this, many of His disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied Him.”
(John 6:66)*

Today's Gospel concludes the series of readings from St. John's sixth chapter. And it does so very powerfully! We've heard the people struggling with Jesus's constant repetition that His flesh and Blood are true food and drink. Today, many of those following Him will stop following Jesus and return to their former ways of life. They do so because they are convicted by Jesus's words.



In John's sixth chapter, Jesus is not offering an allegory. He is NOT saying my Body is "like" food and my Blood is "like" drink. The people listening know He is saying that His Flesh and Blood will become REAL food and drink. And they leave because they cannot accept that Jesus will become real food and drink. Jesus understands that His is a tough teaching, so He turns to the 12 disciples after so many others leave, and He gives them the opportunity to leave as well. Peter responds, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God." In receiving the Eucharist, this must be our response as well.

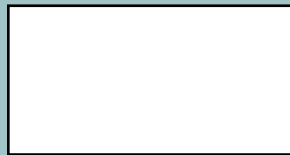
