

groups do provide support in difficult moments but they also provide something essential to every human heart in all seasons of life – friendship!



Scripture of the Week



"What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith but does not have works?" (James 2:14)

Our First Reading this week is one of several passages in Isaiah that tell of the life of the "Servant of the Lord". Most depict a servant who suffers for others,



but through it all stands resolute and firm - steadfast in his faith in God. Suffering, mistreatment, even death and yet there is never a "surrender" but rather a free offering of self, a gift given with supreme faith in God.

This is the heart of our Gospel reading today, for that servant in Isaiah is none other than Jesus, none other than the Son of God Himself. The very simple question Jesus asks His disciples in Mark 8:29 is the most profound question each of us will be asked to answer in our lives. The answer of Peter - "You are the Christ." This is not about an intellectual knowledge - not merely the "right answer to the test". It is the recognition of a soul to the reality of God present within humanity. The answer is not a thing, the answer is a PERSON and we know Him only when we enter into a personal relationship with Him.
