Interfaith Outreach Second Collection

It's time once again to renew our focus on caring for the "least" of our brothers and sisters, right here in our own community. Interfaith Outreach has their annual Sleep Out to raise awareness and funds and will begin Nov. 12.

Holy Name of Jesus will take up a second collection for Interfaith Outreach on Nov. 23-24, to support their efforts. **Please write checks out to HNOJ with IOCP in the memo**. You can go to hnoj.org/interfaith2ndcollection to learn more.

If you and your family have been blessed, please consider sharing those blessings with the poor and homeless among us. After all, as Jesus says in that passage from Matthew: "...whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me."

Interfaith Outreach Reports:

The Sleep Out has prevented homelessness or eviction more than 36,000 times in its 29-year history - including 511 times last year (Fiscal Year 2024: April 1, 2023 - March 31, 2024). In that time, we supported 1,658 households in total; 373 were new to our organization.

MEETING BASIC NEEDS IN OUR COMMUNITY:

Our 2023 research showed that about 1,400 households in our service area have immediate needs, meaning they lack one or more basic needs such as food, clothing or shelter.


Another 1,000 households are at risk of needing IOCP's services due to their financial state. These households may be just one illness, job loss or other emergency away from experiencing crisis.

Perhaps the most notable signal of increased need in our community occurred in the food shelf, where the number of participating households rose about 16.5% from the previous fiscal year.

With your help, we were able to respond to the community's needs:

- Our food shelf distributed 825,604 pounds of food and goods to 1,036 households. We also expanded evening hours to make the food shelf more accessible.
- Our Resale Select thrift store continued to make specific items available
 to clients free of charge. In Fiscal Year 2024, 299 households were
 provided with basic needs items such as winter coats or new socks and
 undergarments.
- To improve clients' experience from the very beginning of their IOCP journey, we began making changes to our intake process. This included shortening response times, standardizing workflows and adding multilingual staff to our Client Intake and Referrals team.



EQUIPPING INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES FOR ONGOING STABILITY: IOCP offers integrated services and programs that, true to our mission, equip households for ongoing stability.

- Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) made it possible for 22 participating households to secure or maintain stable housing - a major step toward achieving ongoing stability.
- Our Neighborhood Program is available to 777 households across nine affordable apartment and townhome communities. Nearly half of these households engaged with our onsite staff to focus on resource navigation, community building, and youth engagement opportunities.
- Our Caring for Kids (CfK) program served 84 local children and their families, spending a total of \$672,902 on childcare or early childhood education scholarships. We estimate the actual need in our community to be four times that number.

Science and Religion Speaker Series

Are science and religion diametrically opposed forces? Can people of faith also follow the evidence of science? Is it possible or right to "believe" in science?

In November, HNOJ is going to tackle these questions and more in a three-part series - Science and Religion.

At each session a presenter from a field of the natural sciences will present a brief talk. Then a panelist of experts discuss the session's topic. The night will conclude with a period of questions and answers from those in attendance.

We will be addressing the intersection of science and religion within topics such as AI, cosmology, medicine, miracles, evolution, the Eucharist and more.




