

Scripture of the Week



"A poor widow also came and put in two small coins worth a few cents." (Mark 12:42)

We begin and end our readings today with stories of poor widows. In our First Reading from 1st Kings, Elijah meets a widow and asks her for a cup of water and then asks also for a bit of



bread. She explains that she was gathering sticks to build a small fire so that she could bake something for herself and her son out of the tiny bit of flour and oil that she had. Her expectation was that this would be their final meal and then they would die of starvation. Elijah encourages her to bake him a small cake first and then something for them promising, "the jar of flour shall not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry".

He is a stranger to her, yet she does as Elijah says and the story continues that she was able to eat for a year along with Elijah and her son. This is trust. This is faith. She heard the command and answered in trust. Our Gospel is the story of the widow's mite. Jesus watches as people make offerings to the temple treasury. A widow comes in and gives a few pennies worth of coins - seemingly all she had. This too, is trust; this too is faith. But this is also love, for this widow gives her all to the God she loves. Do we have the kind of faith that allows us to love so freely?


