"Amen, I say to you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. "But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father." - MK 13:30-32

Because sometimes we act

like it's the end of the world – whether we are a little kid angered by a playground snub, a teenage girl flipping out over an assignment for English class or a college student distraught that she got scheduled for four opening shifts in a row at the coffee house where she works (yes, these are all examples taken straight from my life, why do you ask?).

And sometimes, it really does seem like the end of the world. We lose someone we love to cancer. We miscarry a child before we even get to see his tiny face. The rent is due, and the bank account is overdrawn (also all examples taken straight from my life).

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that when the sun is darkened and the moon no longer gives light, we must look for Him, because His time is near.

He's talking about *The End of the World*. The big one, the apocalypse. But why do I think He's also talking about the end of the world – those sufferings large and small, real and imagined, that make us feel like the sky is caving in?

In both instances, He draws near to us. So let us look for Him.



Communion Procession Update

Beginning on Sunday, Dec. 1, the Eucharistic minister(s) distributing at the back of the church will move to the front and distribute Holy Communion to the main section alongside the priest(s). Thus, instead of having two processions moving in opposite directions for the middle sections, all will process together toward the altar. To accommodate those with limited mobility, our extraordinary ministers are trained to bring the Eucharist to them once they have finished distributing to their sections.

We hope the disruption will be only minimal as we get used to this change. At the same time, how good it will be for us to approach the Lord in unity, together, TOWARD His altar, a sign of His pilgrim people journeying toward our heavenly homeland.

Scripture of the Week



"... the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from the sky...." (Mark 13:24b-25a)

Today marks our second to the last Sunday of the Church's yearly calendar. Our Gospel today has Jesus telling His disciples to prepare for dark days ahead - indeed, the sun,



moon and stars will even cease to provide their light. This sense of impending darkness is both metaphorically telling as we enter the darkest days of our yearly trip around the sun as well as Scripturally as Jesus in Mark's Gospel has finally come back to Jerusalem with His disciples. It is the nearing the end of the calendar year, the end of the Church year, and, for Jesus, nearing the end of His public ministry and earthly life.

But Jesus does not leave us abandoned or hopeless. We know that after His Resurrection and Ascension He will send the Holy Spirit, but even here He makes sure to remind the disciples that His words will not pass away. His words are not "lip service" to some grand ideal. They are Spirit and Truth. Amazing hope indeed!

• Our food shelf distributed 825,604 pounds of food and goods to 1,036 households. We also expanded evening hours to make the food shelf more accessible.

• Our Resale Select thrift store continued to make specific items available to clients free of charge. In fiscal year 2024, 299 households were provided with basic needs items - such as winter coats or new socks and undergarments.

• To improve clients' experience from the very beginning of their IOCP journey, we began making changes to our intake process. This included shortening response times, standardizing workflows and adding multilingual staff to our Client Intake and Referrals team.
