

"Jesus said to his disciples: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him." Matthew 25:31-32a

Today we celebrate the great Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. **This feast is a beautiful yearly reminder for us of Christ's sovereignty over all of creation.** He is not simply King and Lord of us Catholics, but of all peoples, nations and lands; He is Lord and King of all that exists! We see the Church's wisdom in establishing this



feast at the end of the liturgical year, for it points to Christ as King and Lord of time, the One to whom all peoples and nations will be subject, the One who will reign forever and ever.

In His gracious plan for the world, God chose not to force His Divine Kingship upon us, but instead, desires that His creation have the ability to choose Him freely; however, we know that at the end of time all the nations will be gathered before Him, and all peoples will answer to Him. How does our life reflect His Kingship? Have we freely chosen to make Him the Lord of our life, or have we turned to false and empty gods that will certainly fail us? Have we made Him not simply Lord at Church, but also the Lord of our life at home, at work, on our sports team and when we are with our friends?

As Advent approaches and we prepare to begin a new liturgical year, the Church gives us this holy feast as a reminder to reflect on our current journey with the Lord. It is a time to look back on the past year, to acknowledge how we have or haven't allowed Christ to be Lord of our lives. What "New Liturgical Year's" resolutions can I make starting next week to allow my life to be more devoted to my Lord and King? What is the Lord asking that I give up that is keeping me from loving Him. What might He be inviting me to take on that will lead me to be more devoted to Him? Let us joyfully choose to follow the path that leads to everlasting life, with Christ our King as the cornerstone of our life!

Communion Procession Update

Beginning on Sunday, Dec. 1, the Eucharistic minister(s) distributing at the back of the church will move to the front and distribute Holy Communion to the main section alongside the priest(s). Thus, instead of having two processions moving in opposite directions for the middle sections, all will process together toward the altar. To accommodate those with limited mobility, our extraordinary ministers are trained to bring the Eucharist to them once they have finished distributing to their sections.

We hope the disruption will be only minimal as we get used to this change. At the same time, how good it will be for us to approach the Lord in unity, together, TOWARD His altar, a sign of His pilgrim people journeying toward our heavenly homeland.

With your help, in fiscal year 2024, IOCP reported the following:

• Our food shelf distributed 825,604 pounds of food and goods to 1,036 households. We also expanded evening hours to make the food shelf more accessible.

• Our Resale Select thrift store continued to make specific items available to clients free of charge. In fiscal year 2024, 299 households were provided with basic needs items - such as winter coats or new socks and undergarments.

• To improve clients' experience from the very beginning of their IOCP journey, we began making changes to our intake process. This included shortening response times, standardizing workflows and adding multilingual staff to our Client Intake and Referrals team.
