Communion Procession Update

On the Second Sunday of Advent, we will hear from the prophet Baruch: *Up, Jerusalem! stand upon the heights; look to the east and see your children gathered from the east and the west...Led away on foot by their enemies they left you: but God will bring them back to you.* What we have is Israel, once scattered and exiled from Jerusalem because of their unfaithfulness, now being gathered and led by God back to the holy city of Jerusalem. The image is one of a mighty procession from the state of exile toward communion with God in the promised land.

Being a people in "procession" toward God is a central image in our faith. Whenever we partake in a liturgical procession, we are reminded that we are pilgrims journeying toward our true home in heaven, as the book of Hebrews says, "here we have no lasting city, but we seek the city which is to come" (Heb. 13:14). At Mass, we witness the opening procession of the cross bearer, servers, the book of the Gospels and the priest. It calls to mind that we come to meet the Lord in His house. It's an image of the goal of our life's journey, heaven.

Nowhere else is this more evident than the procession of which we partake at Communion. We come forward toward the altar of the Lord, the new Holy of Holies, to encounter the Lord fully present in the Eucharist. There is a powerful unifying gesture expressed when we come forward together and partake of the heavenly food with which Christ feeds us.

To strengthen that powerful unified gesture of coming forward in procession, starting Sunday, Dec. 1, the Eucharistic minister(s) distributing at the back of the church will move to the front and distribute Holy Communion to the main section alongside the priest(s). Thus, instead of having two processions moving in opposite directions for the middle sections, all will process together toward the altar. To accommodate those with limited mobility, our extraordinary ministers are trained to



bring the Eucharist to them once they have finished distributing to their sections.

We hope the disruption will be only minimal as we get used to this change. At the same time, how good it will be for us to approach the Lord in unity, together, toward His altar, a sign of His pilgrim people journeying toward our heavenly homeland.

Since this Solemnity falls on a Sunday, we celebrate the second Sunday of Advent on Dec. 8, and the solemnity is transferred to Monday, Dec. 9. It is not a Holy Day of Obligation this year. 

Parish Advent Reconciliation Service, Dec. 18

Why go to Confession? Jesus gave us the Sacrament of Confession (or Reconciliation) when He breathed on the Apostles saying, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained" (Jn 20:22-23). This authority to forgive sins has been passed on from the apostles to the priests of our own time through the Sacrament of Holy Orders. Confession is the only ordinary means of forgiveness for mortal sins committed after Baptism. Though other extraordinary means are possible, they are never guaranteed and shouldn't be presumed upon. As all sacraments do, it also bestows an increase of grace.

If it's been a few weeks or a few years since your last Confession, you are invited to experience Christ's healing power of forgiveness and mercy! Please join us for our Parish Advent Reconciliation Service on Wednesday, Dec. 18. We will have several priests available from 5:45-8 p.m. in the church.


Don't worry if you don't remember the prayers. We will have examination of conscience available and the priest can walk you through the process.




We invite all parishioners to join in this blessing of the statue at 9:45 a.m. Space will be blocked off and all are welcome to participate in this blessing.



- 2025 Donations: contributions postmarked or received after Jan. 1, 2025, will be credited to tax year 2025.


