Every mother who has ever lost sight of her child in a crowd, even for a few seconds, knows the panic.

I think of Mary living with that level of anxiety for three straight days. I doubt she slept, but I'm sure Joseph forced her to lie down at night, imploring her to think of her



health, to rest while he kept on searching the streets of Jerusalem. I imagine her lying there, eyes open and staring at the ceiling. Mary, full of grace. Mary, spotless of sin. Weeping in the dark, whispering, "Where is he?"

It's an experience that we all have at one point or another. Running through the world, desperate and confused, just trying to find God and failing so miserably that we wonder if He's purposefully eluding us.

If Mary couldn't even find Him, do we stand a chance?

Why didn't Mary think to look in the temple? She had wisdom beyond anyone else who ever lived, at least when it came to Jesus. But I think God purposefully dropped a veil over her reasoning for these three days, so that He could show us it's okay to lose our way.

He isn't eluding us. In fact, He's trying to make it easy. He's staying put, in one place, the very place we should know to look. But the streets of our life are so crowded and loud, so full of distraction.

The Christmas season is about God revealing to us who and what and where He is. He has told us. The guestion is, have we listened?

Scripture of the Week



"And he said to them, 'Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?"" (Luke 2:49)

In today's Gospel, Luke shares with us the familiar story of Jesus being lost and then found again in the temple. Note carefully Luke's choice of words as you listen. The same Luke who recorded Mary's Magnificat and used Mary's name a good half-dozen times while telling the story of the Annunciation and Mary's subsequent visit to Elizabeth will not name Mary or Joseph in today's story. Instead, Luke will use "parents" three times and "mother" twice.

Luke's writings in the original Greek reflect some of the most eloquent Greek writing to be found. Luke was a master of the language and telling a story. So what is he telling us here? This story is two-fold. One, it is about family, specifically a human family, that of Joseph, Mary and Jesus. Secondly, this story also relates the first words of Jesus in Luke's Gospel - "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" Jesus is part of His human family yet never waivers from declaring His Sonship to the Father. I like to think there is a third meaning in this story - when I, or you, feel like we've lost Jesus, we, like Mary and Joseph, can always find Him in His Father's house.
