A New Year, a Year of Jubilee

Similar to the ancient Jewish custom of recognizing every 50th year as a point of reconciliation and forgiveness, the Catholic church has declared that a Jubilee year occur every 25 years. At the closing of the 2000 Jubilee celebration, Pope John Paul II directly addressed the children, "Dear friends, you who are children and young people today will tomorrow form the *first generation of adult Christians* in the third millennium. What a great responsibility you have! You will be the leading players at the *next Jubilee* in 2025." Having been the start of the century and the dawn of the new millennium, it was easy to look with hope towards the future yet to be created. As the Pope said at his closing address, "it is especially necessary for us to direct our thoughts to the future which lies before us. Often during these months we have looked towards the new millennium which is beginning, as we lived this Jubilee not only as a *remembrance of the past*, but also as a *prophecy of the future*."

The commencement of the event is marked by the opening of the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica on Christmas Eve, and people from all over the world are encouraged to partake in a pilgrimage to one of the many holy sites designated by the Holy See, especially appropriate considering the theme of the year is Pilgrims of Hope. For most people, the concepts of reconciliation and forgiveness are most often associated with one's interior disposition and connection with God. But hope, especially in this context, is by its nature expansive and forward facing. Even the act of throwing wide the Holy Doors symbolize the openness and generosity of heart summarized in the theological virtues of faith, hope and charity - in which we are to approach our neighbor and our life in Christ. Spread like the welcoming arms of Jesus, the doors stretch forth as the church calls out to its pilgrim children.

At the onset of this year, I challenge you to contemplate where you have fallen short in love. Where has your heart strayed from the path?

There is a multitude of Biblical evidence that wandering in the wilderness is part of the human condition. As *pilgrims in a strange land*, we either seek the way home or we aimlessly walk the desert. We all have a sense that we belong somewhere else, but intentionally or not, choose to take the convoluted route on our way back home. Thankfully, the Church has provided a map for our journey and help along the way. With hope for a grand homecoming, look forward into the horizon, and take the Lord's hand as you follow the guideposts along the straight path into our Heavenly Father's open arms. I'll be walking by your side..

HNOJ is excited to announce we will be hosting a Lenten Parish Mission March 26 and 27 with Dr. Ed Sri



Beware of Scams

It has come to our attention that there are phishing scams circulating, attempting to exploit the trust and generosity within our community. Please be vigilant and cautious when receiving any emails, messages, or requests that seem suspicious or unfamiliar, especially those seeking personal information or financial contributions. Always remember that Fr. Wratkowski, Fr. Chris Yanta and anyone else from the parish office or school will never email you asking for money, gift cards, social security number or other personal information.



Here are a few tips to ensure your online security:

Nothing is urgent: Phishing emails like to make you feel like you have to act now. Don't fall for it, nothing in an email or text is urgent. You have plenty of time to follow all the tips below.

Check the sender's email address closely: All parish employees' emails end with @hnoj.org. If the email address is for example pastortim@gmail it is not from HNOJ and not to be trusted. Email addresses can be one letter off as well, such as generalmlls instead of generalmills. They are tricky!

Do NOT click links: The 'bad guys' have learned to create real looking emails and even websites, making it hard to decipher if this one is really from your bank or from a bad guy. Make it a habit to go to the website directly. If it says click here for your account information, go to a website as you normally would and log in. If it states click here to donate to HNOJ, go to hnoj.org/give instead.

Cross-check requests: Call the church office or business to verify authenticity of an email request. If you were not expecting an email with an attachment from your friend or colleague, give them a call to see if they sent it.

Update Security Software: Ensure your computer and devices have up-to-date antivirus/anti-malware software and software updates to provide an additional layer of protection.

What to do if you suspect an email or text is pretending to be from Holy Name of Jesus:

- Forward the email or a screenshot of the text to Michelle Hudlow, mhudlow@hnoj.org so we can be aware and act accordingly.
- You can report it to the FTC by going to their website, ftc.gov, and click on report fraud. While you are there you can sign up for their consumer alerts to be in the know about new scams.
- In your email software, mark it as junk. This should also send feedback to your mail server so they can be aware.
- Most importantly, do not respond or reply just delete it.

Your safety and security are of the utmost importance to us. If you ever have concerns or questions about the legitimacy of any communication purportedly from Holy Name of Jesus, please do not hesitate to contact our parish office directly.


