The Baptism of the Lord

Mini Reflection: It makes perfect sense that everyone thought John the Baptist was the Messiah. He was the guy pouring the water. But the Messiah was the man who came to be baptized. He was the one who descended into the waters, submerging himself in our experience of death and pain and sorrow.

Beneath the Surface

When I was seventeen, I wasn't sure that I wanted to be confirmed. It was a



rough period in my life, and I was having some intense questions and doubts. It upset my mother, understandably. She knew that, at such a pivotal and difficult moment, I needed the grace of the sacrament more than ever. So, she called our priest and asked him to talk to me.

After that meeting, I made the decision to be confirmed.

To be honest, I can't remember anything he said to me. All I remember is that he sat with me. He listened to me. He let me talk and talk and talk (and cry). And when he said whatever he said, whatever it is that I cannot remember, it was obvious that he had listened to me.

Reading today's Gospel, it makes perfect sense that everyone thought John the Baptist was the Messiah. He was the guy pouring the water. Of course it seemed natural that he would be "the one." The one they were all waiting for.


But instead, the Messiah was the man who came to be baptized. He was the one who descended into the waters, submerging himself in our experience of death and pain and sorrow – and in doing so, He sanctified it. He made it a means of redemption.

Jesus is our Savior, yes. When we dig ourselves a hole of sin and confusion and we can't climb out, He is the one who brings us back to the surface. But He doesn't pull us out; He lifts us. He jumps down into the pit. He looks around. He offers His hand, gives us a leg up, and by His strength and not our own, we are brought back into the light.

Winter Weekend has been called, "The perfect balance of retreat time with free time to enjoy the resort and just get away with my family."



Scripture of the Week



"And a voice came from Heaven, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased"" (Luke 3:22)

Last week we heard how Jesus came for the entire world when we celebrated His epiphany. Today we hear how each of us can enter into His coming and begin our walk with Jesus through receiving the baptism of water in the



name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The people in the Gospel today look to John trying to find the Messiah.

John is clear that he is not the Messiah. And Jesus comes and is baptized by John. It is important to note that Jesus did not need the purification that baptism gives us, but He submitted to a baptism of water as an example to each of us. In humility we come before the Lord, placing the will of the Father above our own. Most of us were baptized as infants or very young children. It is the adult "me" that has to decide to accept the gift given at baptism and choose to allow the Father's will to guide my decisions and actions. "Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done..."
