Hear My Voice

During the first two Saturdays in March, kids that are participating in the First Sacraments program at HNOJ took part in a First Reconciliation retreat. The children worked their way through hands-on stations that built upon the learning done with their families at home. The morning culminated in the confessional. Through the priest, the children got to experience the love and mercy of Christ in the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the very first time. You hope for the best, but never really know how the kids are going to respond - will they be fearful, resistant or even cry? As parents and catechists, we try to assure them that it is a time of joy and freedom. Honestly, I would even understand it if they said they felt a simple sense of relief, as this is often my own response to the Sacrament. Surprisingly, more often than not, the kids walk out of the church beaming from ear to ear, their faces animated with excitement. Seldom have I seen adults react the same way.

A few weeks ago, I was waiting in line for the confessional at my home church, Saints Joachim and Anne in Shakopee. An older gentleman left the confessional and walked over to address the growing row of anxious penitents, "I hate having to confess to Fr. Becker because I know he knows my voice, and I always have to confess the same things." No one really knew how to respond. After thinking about it a while, I'd have to agree; seldom do we bring anything new to the confessional. Which, come to think of it, is probably good. There certainly isn't anything to be gained by having a whole new set of sins each time. What happens in Vegas might stay in Vegas, but you can't hide it from God, so off to Confession you go. Anyway, most adults are usually too busy with day-to-day life to have the time or energy to try out a whole new list of sins.

And so, week after week, month after month, and eventually, year after year, we guiltily get back in line next to (probably) the same people we were in line with last time, to confess the same old things. "Father, forgive me for I have sinned. It has been x amount of time since my last confession. These are my sins - blah, blah, blah, blah, blah..."

But shouldn't the weariness we feel from this process, boredom with our own, repetitive failures, prompt us to try harder and just be *better*? Yes, of course. As part of the Act of Contrition we say, "I am sorry for my sins with all my heart," later followed by, "I firmly intend...to sin no more," and presumably we are going to Confession because we genuinely want to repair our relationship with the Lord. If we didn't do the sin, we wouldn't have to go to Confession. Still, here we are.

The funny thing is, that even while we tire of feeling like we aren't able to change, and keep persisting in our sin, Christ never tires of hearing our voice. When we confess that sin for the fifth, twentieth, hundredth time, or more, Christ hears your voice and smiles that you have made your way back to Him. I don't know if Father recognizes your voice, but I know that Christ most certainly does, and that is something to rejoice.

The Watchfire

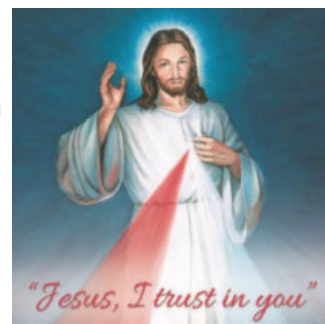
You are invited to gather with family and friends to tend the watchfire and prayerfully prepare for the coming of our Lord this Easter.

The watchfire is a Holy Name of Jesus tradition that provides an opportunity to pray and ponder our Lord's sacrifice and anticipate His Glorious Resurrection. This fire is lit after the reposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Holy Thursday Mass and extinguished at the Easter Vigil on Saturday evening.

Divine Mercy Sunday, April 27

From Saint Faustina's diary: "Jesus said to me, Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You. I desire that this image be venerated, first in your chapel, and then throughout the world... I desire that there be a Feast of Mercy. I want this image to be solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter; that Sunday is to be the Feast of Mercy." (Diary of Saint Faustina, Notebook 1, paragraphs 47 and 49).



At HNOJ there will be a Divine Mercy Chaplet prayed after all the Sunday Masses on April 27, with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. This prayer is spoken, and prayed using an ordinary Rosary. This prayer contains the repetition of praying the phrase, "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world".

Remember, you can start the novena on Good Friday.

Vacation Bible School 2025 - Come, Holy Spirit!

Are you ready for the BEST week of the summer?! VBS registration for 2025 is now open! Please check our VBS website at hnoj.org/vbs for the registration form. Our theme this year is *Come, Holy Spirit!* VBS takes place at Holy Name of Jesus June 9-12, from 8:30 a.m.-Noon.

What is VBS?

Vacation Bible School is a special four-day faith-filled AND fun-filled time to kick off the summer and get closer to the Lord. Open to kids ages four through 5th grade (entering 5th grade in the fall of 2025,) kids will have the opportunity to make friends, craft, sing, play games, pray and learn about God's love, with the Holy Spirit as our guide. Children who will be four in the fall and are potty trained are eligible to register at the preschool level. Each day, participants will spend time at four centers designed to help see and feel the role of the Holy Spirit in the Bible, the Church, and our lives, all in a child-friendly way. How much does it cost to attend to VBS?

The cost is \$50 per participant. Any registrations received after May 9 will be charged a \$5 late fee. Our registration deadline is May 26.

With that, we can't have Vacation Bible School without volunteers! We need energetic and faith-filled teens and adults who would like to share their love of Christ with the participants by volunteering to lead them through the week.

Those who have applied will be contacted via email within a week of receiving the application to inform you if your application has been accepted.

Adults who are 18 years of age can register online to serve as a volunteer by using the Adult Volunteer Form found at hnoj.org/vbs. We are seeking adults to serve as leaders in the various VBS Centers. Adults are also needed to serve as Group Leaders and Nurses. 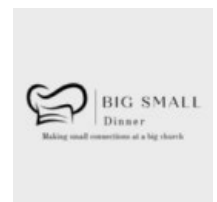


Big Small Dinner, April 30

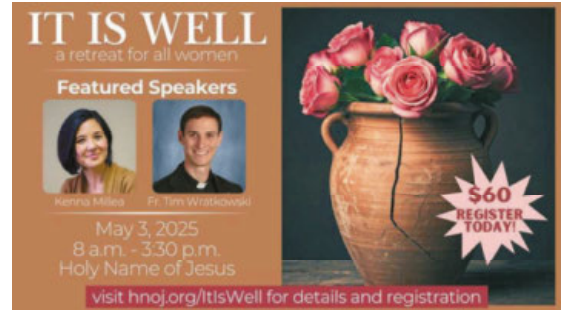


Women's Retreat, Register Today!

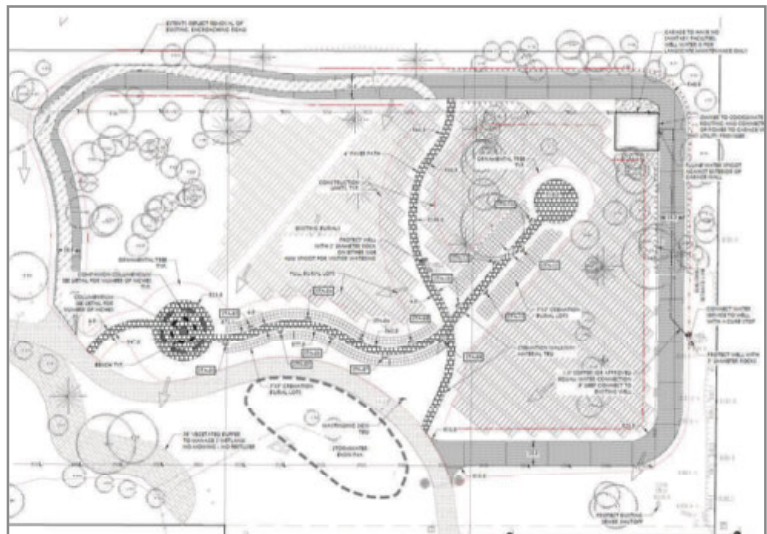
Exciting Developments at Holy Name Cemetery

As some of you may have noticed a blue sign at Holy Name Cemetery, we have begun the process of seeking approval to develop vacant land for the expansion of the cemetery. HNOJ acquired this land in 2021 and has partnered with Louks for civil engineering and landscape architecture services to bring this vision to life.

This multi-year development will include the addition of full casket burial plots, buried niches and a granite columbarium for above-ground niches. The thoughtfully designed landscaping will feature winding walking paths, benches for prayer and reflection, and the installation of Stations of the Cross, creating a peaceful space for contemplation and remembrance.

Additionally, the project will include the construction of a new maintenance garage, tucked away in the corner of the property to preserve the serene atmosphere of the cemetery. The existing road will be extended to circulate around the cemetery, and in compliance with city requirements, a new rain garden will be added. New trees will also be planted to replace those that need to be removed during the project. The ancient and the current cemetery will be preserved and not impacted by this development.

We invite you to reach out to the city to offer your support and pray for approval from the Medina City Council for this important project. We look forward to providing a serene and beautiful space for our community to honor their loved ones for many years to come. Stay tuned for further updates!

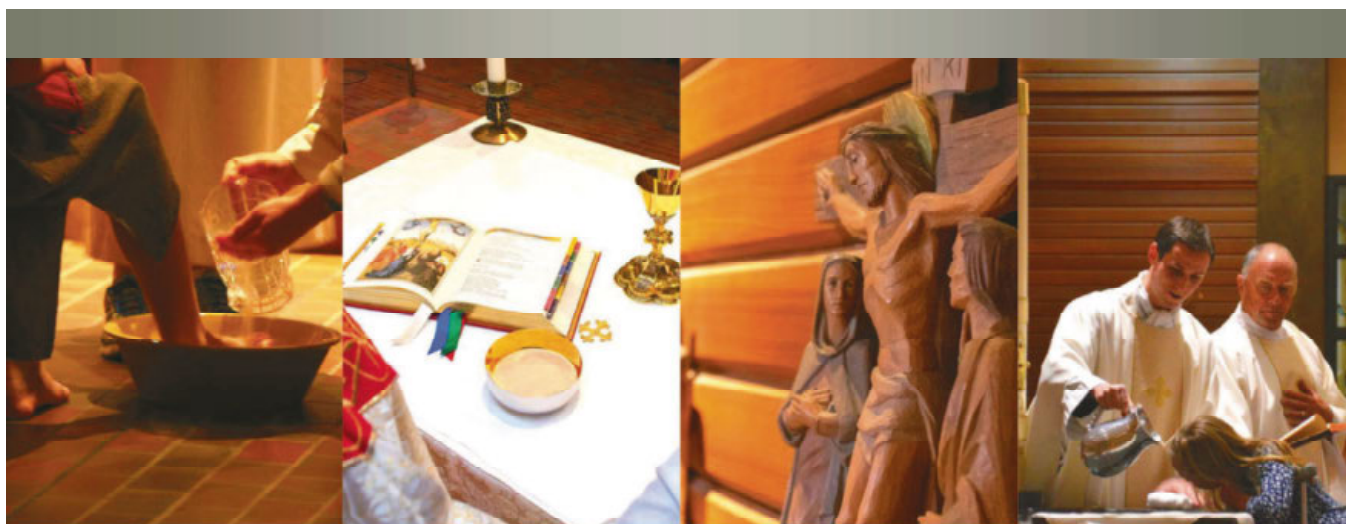
